






# Explanation of map symbols






## Land forms

|   |   |

|  | Spot height, triangulation point<br>Contours, interval 10 m |
|  | Distinct earth bank, earth wall,<br>gully                   |
|  | Impassable cliffs, cliff / large rock<br>in ground shape    |
|  | Distinct rock pillar  |

Spot height on a top hill is somewhere, not everywhere, bannered by a triangulation stick or even wooden construction of pyramidal shape.

Only large, usually impassable cliffs on map. Some might be missing. We do not recommend to climb these rocks especially at night and when it is wet.






## Water and marsh

|  | Spring or water source,<br>well                 |

You won't find any impassable watercourse or dangerous marsh in the map, at most squelching bogs. Please do not enter the bogs marked with darker green. Usually these are inside of protected areas and/or might be deeper.

Springs usually provide drinking water.






## Forest, fields, meadows and urban areas

|  | Nature reserve<br>- forbidden to pass       |

It is prohibited to cross private areas! Private areas - cabins and hamlets are often non-enclosed, nevertheless you should rather keep away of them.

The map shows rough open areas (only at the Czech part of the map). These might be well overgrown and should serve only as navigation landmark not as way of easy passage.








## Man-made features

There are plenty of exclusion fences in forest. Not all of them are drawn in the map, but during the rogaine it is prohibited to cross any fence!

It is also strictly prohibited to enter zones of drinking water conservation, game enclosures and nature conservancy reserves or wildfowl protection areas. In the map they are hatched by symbol of "Restricted area". Don't risk disqualification and heavy fine!

## Roads, paths, ski-lifts, cable-way and power lines

Please take the track and path classification in the map with a pinch of salt – a map is always only an imperfect attempt to transfer real picture of landscape on paper. We preferably advise to keep away from railway and cross it only when you feel sure of not being run over by a train.
